process on whether or not to make an award in Region C. In round numbers, I would guess that would start at quarter of 11 or thereabouts.

There's one item on the agenda, racing division, Director Lightbaum. The ball is in your court.

DR. LIGHTBAUM: Good morning, Commissioners. George Brown, the chairman of the Massachusetts Thoroughbred Breeders Association has submitted a request to run six restricted races at Finger Lakes this spring.

As you recall last year I believe it was around August 20 we had a similar request in front of us for them to be able to run races at Finger Lakes last year which they did. And it was successful as far as breeders go.

This is in response to us not having a full season of racing, of thoroughbred racing in Massachusetts. The breeders do intend to save enough money so that they'll be able to do their regular stakes races at Suffolk during those six days that they race. And then also money to run some restricted races at the Brockton Fair also.

And my recommendation is to approve this. It's part of the legislation too. Catherine could speak to that if you want. They did get that changed in Chapter 128 which is the agricultural regulations.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: They got what

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changed?
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DR. LIGHTBAUM: They got it changes so that they could race races outside of Massachusetts. That was done last year. If you have any questions, Mr . Brown is here today.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Okay.
COMMISSIONER STEBBINS: Do you want
to invite him to say something?
CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Questions or Mr.
Brown, did you have anything to say at the outset?

MR. BROWN: No, just if you have any questions.

COMMISSIONER CAMERON: Mr. Chair, I think this is a sound recommendation. I agree with it. It worked well last year. Having the Mass. bred horses have the opportunity to race

for those funds is really an important piece for the breeders. Again, it is uncertain how many days we'll have this year in the Commonwealth. So, this just is a nice plan to supplement whatever days we have here and whatever opportunities there are.

So, I agree with this

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recommendation.
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CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Anybody else, questions? Commissioner?

COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: Yes, this request of course would come with supplemental monies from Horse Race Development Fund for these races; is that correct?

MR. BROWN: From the breeders, yes.
COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: For the
breeders' piece.
CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Not the Race Horse Development Fund, but the breeders' share.

DR. LIGHTBAUM: The breeders' share.
COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: The breeders' share of the Race Horse Development Fund.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: That was going to be my question too. Thank you. It says funds
have been set aside to run 10 stakes, that's out of the breeders' funds.

DR. LIGHTBAUM: Correct, out of the breeders' funds.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: How much is that?
What's been set aside? Why is that not detailed here?

MR. BROWN: We are going to run six races at Finger Lakes to begin with. One of the reasons for that is we have no place to get our horses fit to run before the Suffolk Downs races. So, we planned on running these races at Finger Lakes to help get these horses fit. And these races are $\$ 35,000$ apiece.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: That's the purse, the total purse per race?

MR. BROWN: Yes. Then we have nine races, we plan on running nine races at Suffolk Downs for purses of $\$ 75,000$ each. And we were going to try to run one race at Finger Lakes later in the year for $\$ 75,000$ because it's hard to get the two-year-olds ready to run by August or September. A lot of them don't get ready that soon.

So, we figured we'd run that race at Finger Lakes and that way we could put it off until November and give everybody a chance to get ready for that two-year-old race.

And depending on what happens with Brockton, we would have money left over for races at Brockton. And if Brockton doesn't get ready this year, we could run the rest of them at Finger Lakes.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: So, the $\$ 35,000$
and the $\$ 75,000$ purses is supplemented by breeders' money. It's not the full --

MR. BROWN: It's not out of the
Horse Development Fund. It's out of the breeders' money.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Okay.
COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: I'm sorry. To make a distinction, it does come from the Race Horse Development Fund which has two pots of money, one going to the thoroughbreds that race here and another one that goes to the breeders.

MR. BROWN: That we have 16 percent of that money from the Horse Development Fund that goes to the breeders.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Right.
COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: So, would we get an actual request for those money or is it implicit in what Mr. Brown just said?

DR. LIGHTBAUM: It's implicit in
what he said. Once the money goes over to the breeders, it's basically up to them how they spend it. Obviously, if there was some crazy thing out there, we might have a comment on it. But basically that 16 percent goes to them. And they decide how they want to fund their races.

COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: Fair enough, but my point being more basic. There's enough balance in the fund to use it.

DR. LIGHTBAUM: Yes. And there's money going into it every week.

COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: With the activity from the slots parlor.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: So people know, money from Plainridge, nine percent of the daily gross gaming revenue from Plainridge is going into the Race Horse Development and that continues to supplement the breeders and the

thoroughbred.
COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: And the
standardbreds as well.

CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Yes, and the standardbreds as well, right.

I'm fine with this as Commissioner

Cameron recommends. I just would like for the heck of it, I'd like to see the arithmetic when we've got it just out of curiosity. What's in the fund, what's being used, not for yay or nay purposes, but just for informational purposes.

COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: You know, I've been thinking about a good report, the end of fiscal year is approaching. It could be a good occasion for us to detail the credits and debits to all those funds that have been taking place. I do sign off on the transfers as the Treasurer of the Commission. But a balance of the historical year $I$ think is going to be very good information to bring to the Commission very soon.

DR. LIGHTBAUM: The breeders have to do a report anyway and turn that in.

MR. BROWN: We have an audit.

DR. LIGHTBAUM: An audit that they have to do. So, they can certainly make that audit available to us when it's done.

MR. BROWN: It just got completed.
COMMISSIONER STEBBINS: I would also
add, Alex and Mr. Brown I welcome you to come back before the Commission and kind of give us updates as to how these races happened, obviously closer to the end of the year, obviously. But we'd be anxious to see what the results were and kind of get a sense from you as to their success.

Mr. Chairman, I'd move the

Commission approve the request of the
Massachusetts Thoroughbred Breeders Association to run six restricted Mass. Bred races at Finger Lakes Racecourse this spring with funds set aside to race at least nine stakes races at Suffolk Raceway and some restricted races at Brockton.

COMMISSIONER CAMERON: Second.
CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Further
discussion? All in favor, aye.
COMMISSIONER MACDONALD: Aye.

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COMMISSIONER CAMERON: Aye.
COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: Aye.
COMMISSIONER STEBBINS: Aye.
CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Opposed? The ayes have it unanimously.

DR. LIGHTBAUM: Thank you.
COMMISSIONER CAMERON: Thank you.
CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Thank you. Do we have any other business for this public meeting? Do I have a motion to adjourn?

COMMISSIONER CAMERON: So moved.
CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Second?
COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: Second.
CHAIRMAN CROSBY: All in favor, aye.
COMMISSIONER MACDONALD: Aye.
COMMISSIONER CAMERON: Aye.
COMMISSIONER ZUNIGA: Aye.
COMMISSIONER STEBBINS: Aye.
CHAIRMAN CROSBY: Opposed? We are
adjourned.
