### **Participation Goals Review**

#### **Consultant / Contractor Participation – Design Contracts:**

Minority Business Enterprise (MBE): 7.9%

Women Business Enterprise (WBE): 10%

Veteran Business Enterprise (VBE): 1%

#### **Contractor Participation – Construction Contracts:**

Minority Business Enterprise (MBE): 5%

Women Business Enterprise (WBE): 5.4%

Veteran Business Enterprise (WBE): 1%

#### **Workforce Participation – Construction (% of workforce hours):**

Minorities: 15.3%

Women: 6.9%

Veterans: 3%

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## **Design: M/W/VBE Participation**

- Design work is in progress. The majority of the design work will be awarded and completed by the end of 2016.
- As of November 30th, 2015 Wynn had awarded 15.7% of design contracts to M/W/VBEs:
  - 7.1% of design contracts to MBEs (7.9% goal), up from 6.7% awarded as of October 31st, with one new design contract awarded to MBE Nobis Engineers for roadway engineering.
  - 2.4% of design contracts to WBEs (10.0% goal), the same percentage awarded as of October 31<sup>st</sup>, with no new awards to WBEs.
  - 6.2% of design contracts to VBEs (1.0% goal), the same percentage awarded as of October 31<sup>st</sup>, with no new awards to VBEs.



### **Design: M/W/VBE Participation**

- Wynn expects to achieve 10.3% MBE, 7.5% WBE, and 6.5% VBE participation over the next several months, following the award of contracts in the pipeline.
- Wynn expects to exceed its overall goal of 18.9% diverse design contracts with a total of 24.3% M/W/VBE participation on design contracts.

# Design & Construction Outreach: M/W/VBE Participation

- Participated on the Success Stories Panel with Jacobs and DREAM Collaborative at the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Supplier Diversity Best Practices Forum.
- Met with multiple veterans support groups and VBEs working in remediation and general contracting.
- Firms bidding on the Construction Manager role for the Project presented M/W/VBE subcontracting strategies as part of the interview and selection process.



#### Construction: M/W/VBE Participation

- Pre-construction work began on the site in early September, with two construction contracts awarded in September and October:
  - 1. Site Clearing & Fencing: Cashman Marine & Dredging
  - 2. Remediation: Charter Contracting Company (MBE)
- No new construction contracts were awarded in November.
- Represents a small fraction of the overall project construction work.

### **Construction: Workforce Participation**

- Pre-construction work began on the site in early September. As of November 28th, contractors had completed 2,700 hours of work.
- 54 individuals have performed work on the site, including 13 minorities, 1 female, and 3 veterans.
- Represents a small fraction of the overall project construction work.

#### **Construction: Workforce Participation**

- Charter and subcontractors making weekly requests (written and verbal) to local unions for female, veteran, and Everett resident workers.
- Workforce diversity strategy and past workforce diversity performance a key component of Construction Manager interview and selection process.
- Completed Building Trades Apprenticeship industry briefing and training for five local Career Centers. Initiated partnership with vocational schools to encourage young women to pursue careers in the building trades.
- Sent email blast and social media notifications to community members, job fair attendees, and community partners regarding December Building Trade apprenticeship application opportunities.
- Presented diversity goals to Massachusetts Building Congress members.

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
