'PUBLIC HEARING' NOTIFICATION AND GUIDELINES

Massachusetts Gaming Commission to Host 'Public Hearing' on Proposed Regulations Regarding Licensing for Gaming Employees and Vendors *MassGaming invites written public comment on draft regulations*

- WHO:** Members of the *Massachusetts Gaming Commission* including **Chairman Steve Crosby, Commissioner Gayle Cameron, Commissioner James McHugh, Commissioner Bruce Stebbins** and **Commissioner Enrique Zuniga** and members of the public
- WHAT:** MassGaming will hear public comments regarding a set of new and updated draft regulations. The proposed regulations cover the licensing and registration of key gaming employees, gaming employees, gaming vendors, and the registration of gaming service employees, non-gaming vendors, and labor organizations.
