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The Massachusetts Gaming Commission Releases January 2019 Gross Gaming Revenue for Plainridge Park Casino and MGM Springfield

The Massachusetts Gaming Commission reported today that the month of January 2019 at Plainridge Park Casino (PPC) and MGM Springfield generated approximately **\$32 million** in Gross Gaming Revenue (GGR). PPC, a category 2 slots facility, is taxed on 49% of GGR. Of that total taxed amount, 82% is paid to Local Aid and 18% is allotted to the Race Horse Development Fund. MGM Springfield, a category 1 resort-casino, is taxed on 25% of GGR; those monies are <u>allocated to several specific state funds</u> as determined by the gaming statute.

To date, the Commonwealth has collected approximately **\$320 million** in total taxes and assessments from PPC and MGM since the respective openings of each gaming facility.
