<p>The Town of Agawam borders the City of Springfield and provides arteries that connect vehicle traffic from other Western Massachusetts towns and the state of Connecticut to the City of Springfield. Agawam is in a geographic position that has been impacted by vehicle traffic traveling both to and from the MGM casino. An increase in traffic impacts public safety and police resources by increasing things such as traffic accidents, hit and runs, speeding and other motor vehicle infractions. OUI arrests of people traveling from the MGM casino can also be expected to rise. Agawam is also the home of Six Flags New England and people drop children off for the day while they patron the casino. The cameras will be placed on roadways commonly used for casino traffic.</p>

<p>The detective bureau is responsible for major cases, drug investigations and general property crimes that require following up on cases, preserving evidence and initiating investigations into crimes and criminal enterprises. The traffic bureau is responsible for all traffic enforcement, crashes, hit and run accidents and fatal crashes. The department will lease six Flock Falcon license plate recognition (LPR) cameras for three years year. The department hopes to place Flock cameras strategically throughout Agawam in hopes that they will be instrumental in solving crimes as they have been in neighboring communities. Flock cameras in other communities have been helpful in helping Agawam solve crimes. We are proposing to lease six Flock cameras to aide in the monitoring of vehicle traffic within the city of Agawam, particularly on the streets that are heavily traveled routes leading to and from the MGM casino. These tools would enable us to study the traffic patterns of motorists by using their data analysis tools. In addition, these cameras would be instrumental in identifying suspects involved in crimes that occur within the City of Agawam and would aid the City of Springfield as our close geographic location and sharing of a border results in suspects easily passing between the two cities. Using these tools to solve crimes would also mitigate any future crimes that would have been committed by</p>	

that suspect.
