**2. IMPACT DESCRIPTION/CONNECTION TO GAMING FACILITY**

**a) Please describe in detail the impact that is attributed to the operation of gaming facility**

1. The lighting design for the lower Broadway corridor – especially near the entrance/exit of the Encore – although from a design perspective is nice, it presents some issues for pedestrian and traffic safety. Currently the Police use light towers borrowed from the City of Everett DPW. The department also needs a location to store traffic safety cones and other equipment that is near the casino. Currently these items are stored in the back of a pickup truck and transported to the site.
2. As the city comes out of COVID response – Encore continues to see increases in persons accessing the facility and the surrounding areas. This increase in visitors and transients in the lower Broadway area will require additional response to events from fights, traffic accidents, OUI, and other increase in crimes and calls for service- pulling resources from other locations with the City of Everett.
3. Mass State Police and Everett Police members of the Gaming Enforcement Unit Operate on a multi-band radio system. The Everett Police Patrol Operations officers do not have access to the multi-band technology. This creates a public safety emergency when patrol is dispatched for an incident where they have no direct communication with the GEU and do not have the ability to directly coordinate activities.

**c) How do you anticipate your proposed remedy will address the identified impact?**

1. By procuring 2 new light towers – the department can return the borrowed equipment to the DPW for other uses. Also providing a location where the department can store public safety equipment in a secure container, officers will have the equipment they need for traffic and pedestrian safety on hand.
2. By providing additional officers dedicated specifically to maintaining public safety in and around the casino area - it will limit the amount of officers that have to be resourced from other issues with the City and provide a standard level of service to the people of Everett.
3. The purchase of 20 Motorola Multi-band portable radios will allow us to outfit multiple supervisory personnel, who when they respond to an incident can aid in the coordination of police support between the GEU and EPD.

1. Funds will be a onetime purchase and delivery of equipment

2. Funds will be used to pay for up to 150 extra patrols of 4 hour blocks using 2 officers at a time. Average overtime rate is \$68.36 hour. For two officers in 4 hr blocks the total would be \$547.00 per rotation. Patrols will cover nights, weekends holidays and special events as required.

3. Funds will be a onetime purchase and delivery of equipment

1. Extra light will increase visibility for both pedestrian and vehicular traffic and storage for equipment in the area

2. Extra patrols dedicated to the Encore Casino area and lower Broadway will elevate the need to pull resources from the rest of the City so that the department can maintain a level of service to the City

3. Procurement will improve inter-agency communications and officer safety

**e) How will you provide the data for reporting? How will you measure the effectiveness of the proposed project in mitigating impacts?**

The EPD can and has historically produced call logs illustrating the added traffic, incidents, and public safety need as a direct result of casino patronage.

The HCA was executed in 2013, and the City could not anticipate what the impact of the around-the-clock nature of the business with the longer alcohol service would eventually be. After a reasonable learning curve, the need and impact became better defined through experience. Covid and other related challenges have presented another pattern of public safety concerns. Alcohol could be served on the gaming floor from 2:00AM to 4:00AM continues to pose challenges and a late night influx of patronage. As such, it is reasonable that the extra resources are required, affecting the regular course of business unanticipated ways.

***Specific Impact Grant Application – Waiver Request***

The City of Everett respectfully requests a waiver of the \$500,000 limit on specific impact grants for 2022. The City has submitted multiple grant requests to fund for specific impacts directly related to the operation of Everett Boston Harbor (“EBH”). While no single request exceeds \$500,000, the combined requests do exceed that amount. It just happens that Everett’s specific impact grant requests are public safety intensive. The City submits that, as the host community of the largest gaming facility in the state, its request for a waiver of the public safety operational cost limit is reasonable.

The requested waiver would allow the City to receive specific impact grants as outlined in the applications, for the following:

**Police Department**

1. Item 1 – 20’ Office/Storage Container (CONEX) \$22,073.00; Item 2 – 2ea 6kw Light Towers \$24,550.00 Total Request: \$46,623.00
2. Request is made for the amount of \$82,032.00 dollars
3. 20ea Motorola APX 8000 Mult-band Portable Radio - \$180,599.00

**TOTAL AMOUNT: \$309,000.00**

**Fire Department**

1. Public Safety Communications Equipment: \$353,000

Accordingly, the total of Everett’s Specific Impacts Grant requests is \$662,300.00, over the \$500,000 cap on such grant requests.

As indicated above, and as described more fully in the separate grant applications filed by the Fire Department and Police Department, each of its public safety requests is for funding to address public safety impacts clearly and directly related to EBH. As noted, overtime has accounted for \$82,032.00, and the remainder is for much needed public safety equipment, most importantly communications equipment that has been determined over the last several years of operation to be essential to keeping the vastly increased transit population, as well as the local population, safe via reliable first responder communications in and between departments.

Moreover, the City submits that this request could be viewed as a unique capital expense that is outside of the \$500,000 limit on public safety “operational” costs.
