1. IMPACT DESCRIPTION

Please describe in detail the impact that is attributed to the operation of a gaming facility. Please provide support for the determination that the operation of the gaming facility caused or is causing the impact.

The opening of the MGM Springfield gaming facility in August of 2018 has resulted in additional public safety needs for the manning of related traffic incidents and EMS calls. The proximity of West Springfield to the MGM Casino results in the main travel corridors through town serving as a primary travel route to and from the casino. As a response to these needs, West Springfield has added (4) four dispatchers, (4) patrolmen and (8) firefighters/EMS to our budget.

In anticipation of the opening of the MGM Springfield Casino, the Town of West Springfield budgeted an increase in the number of patrolmen for an anticipated start date in the spring of 2018 to allow sufficient time for new patrolmen to attend the police academy to be fully trained by the opening date of the casino. Subsequently, the Town also budgeted to increase the number of dispatchers to handle additional call volume and ensure trained E911 professionals are on duty in dispatch positions without the need to sub in patrolmen. The police department received 11,936 call for service the year preceding the opening of MGM Springfield (August 2017 to July 2018) and 13,789 calls the year subsequent to the opening of MGM Springfield (August 2018 to July 2019), a 15.5% increase. Additionally, there has been an increase in motor vehicle accidents of 24% since the opening of MGM Springfield.

EMS calls were anticipated to increase with the opening of the MGM Springfield casino. West Springfield obtained a federal SAFER Grant to add (8) firefighters/EMS which provided necessary staffing to run a third ambulance. Staff were hired in January of 2018 under the SAFER Grant. The Grant provided for 75% reimbursement in year one and year two (January 28, 2018 to January 27, 2019 and January 28, 2019 to January 27, 2020 respectively) and 30% reimbursement in year three (January 28, 2020 to January 27, 2021). As we enter the third year of the SAFER Grant, West Springfield will be responsible for 70% of the staffing costs. Upon conclusion of the SAFER Grant, West Springfield will be responsible for 100% of the staffing costs. As justification to support the increased staffing, Fire/EMS calls were reviewed from the casino opening of August 24, 2018 to current (January 17, 2020) and compared to comparable time frame prior to the casino opening, August 24, 2016 to January 17, 2018. The time period subsequent to the casino opening resulted in 11,033 total calls, of which 9,115 were EMS related. The time period prior to the casino opening resulted in 10,308 total calls, of which 8,591 were EMS related. During the 17 month time period subsequent to the opening of the casino the fire department had an increase in volume of 725 overall calls (+7%); an increase of 524 more EMS calls (+6%).

Funding will be used to pay the FY 2021 public safety operating costs, July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021.

Exhibit A identifies the additional staffing costs for public safety personnel hired to mitigate the effects of the MGM Springfield Casino. The annual cost for additional staffing for FY 2021 is estimated to be \$1,061,736.92. The Town will receive \$375,000 directly from MGM Springfield under our SCA to mitigate the anticipated adverse effects of the MGM Springfield Project. Applying 100% of the SCA annual payment to public safety alone, the amount funded locally for additional public safety staff is anticipated to be \$686,736.92. A grant award in the amount of \$200,000 would reduce the burden on the municipal operating budget to \$486,736.92 for FY 2021.

As indicated above, West Springfield has committed to the employment of additional public safety personnel to handle the increased need for dispatch, patrolmen and EMS services. The requested funding will decrease the burden on the municipal operating budget, which exceeds the funding received under our SCA with MGM Springfield.

Additional public safety staffing were added to the police and fire department budgets as a result of the opening of MGM Springfield. Staffing comparison from the FY 2017 Operating Budget(pre MGM Springfield) to the FY 2020 Operating Budget (post MGM Springfield) is below:

West Springfield will maintain separate fund accounting for all grant related expenditures. Only expenditures approved for funding by the terms of the grant agreement between the MA Gaming Commission and the Town of West Springfield will be charged to the grant fund.

The Surrounding Community Agreement between MGM Springfield and The Town of West Springfield provides for \$375,000 annually in recognition that West Springfield will experience significant adverse impacts as a result of the Project. While the SCA does not specifically address those impacts, among the impacts anticipated were public safety, inclusive of crime, motor vehicle accidents and ambulance calls as well as traffic and maintenance related issues to infrastructure resulting from increased usage. Additionally, the SCA requires West Springfield to exercise good faith efforts to secure state funding for any remaining Net Adverse Impact Amounts through the Community Mitigation Fund. While the one year look back study is not yet complete, we believe the employee costs identified in Exhibit A, which exceed the \$375,000 annual SCA payment, are indicative of a Net Adverse Impact.
