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Baseline Negative Impacts of Gambling in Massachusetts

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Baseline Online Panel Survey

- Online Panels not representative, but useful in oversampling people with high rates of pathology (including problem gambling). Only 129 problem gamblers in Baseline General Population Survey (BGPS) using Address-Based Sampling, with n = 9,578.
- Ipsos Baseline Online Panel Survey (BOPS):
 - -Oct 2013 Mar 2014 (coincident with BGPS)
 - -n = 5,046
 - -Weighting via iterative raking
 - ➤ 317 problem gamblers
 - Modest, but significant differences with BGPS problem gamblers (i.e., younger, more tobacco use, fewer immigrants, greater engagement in extreme sports, more bingo participation), thus results reported separately



Baseline Negative <u>Financial</u> Impacts of Gambling

- Financial problems most commonly reported negative impact of gambling
 - Gamblers: 3.9%
 - Problem Gamblers: 48.0% (BGPS) 54.8% (BOPS)
- Bankruptcy because of gambling
 - Problem Gamblers: 5.2% (BOPS) 5.6% (BGPS)
 - Projects to ~5,000 bankruptcies per year



Baseline Negative <u>Health</u> Impacts of Gambling

- Health and Stress-Related problems because of gambling almost as common
 - Gamblers: 3.8%
 - Problem Gamblers: 47.7% (BGPS) 49.6% (BOPS)
- Gambling-related health or mental health problems resulted in seeking medical or psychological help
 - Problem Gamblers: 3.9% (BGPS) 8.7% (BOPS)
 - ~6,500 people



Baseline Negative <u>Mental Health</u> Impacts of Gambling

- Significant guilt, anxiety, or depression because of gambling
 - Gamblers: 3.2%
 - Problem Gamblers: 31.4% (BOPS) 36.5% (BGPS)
- Suicidal thoughts because of gambling
 - Problem Gamblers: 4.5% (BOPS) 4.9% (BGPS)
 - ~5,000 people
- Suicide attempts because of gambling
 - Problem Gamblers: 0.2% (BGPS) 3.4% (BOPS)
 - ~1,900 people



Baseline <u>Relationship</u> Impacts of Gambling

- Relationship Problems because of gambling
 - Gamblers: 1.2%
 - Problem Gamblers: 13.7% (BOPS) 18.8% (BGPS)
- Neglect of children or family because of gambling
 - Problem Gamblers: 6.1% (вдря) 9.1% (воря); ~8,000 people
- Domestic Violence because of gambling
 - Problem Gamblers: 5.2% (BOPS) 6.3% (BGPS); ~6,000 people
- Separation or Divorce because of gambling
 - Problem Gamblers: 3.7% (BOPS) 3.8% (BGPS); ~4,000 people
- Child Welfare Services Involvement because of gambling
 - Problem Gamblers: 0.0% (вдря) 3.4% (воря); ~1,800 people



Baseline <u>Work or School</u> Impacts of Gambling

- Work or School Problems because of gambling
 - Gamblers: 0.4%
 - Problem Gamblers: 5.8% (BGPS) 9.3% (BOPS)
- Lost job or quit school because of gambling
 Problem Gamblers: 3.0% (popp) = 3.2% (popp): ~3.300 per
 - Problem Gamblers: 3.0% (ворѕ) 3.2% (вдрѕ); ~3,300 people
- Received Public Assistance or Welfare Payments
 because of gambling

- Problem Gamblers: 2.3% (BGPS) - 3.0% (BOPS); ~2,800 people



Baseline <u>Illegal Activity</u> Impacts of Gambling

- Committed Illegal Acts because of gambling
 - Gamblers: 0.5%; ~11,000 people
 - Problem Gamblers: 2.7% (BGPS) 8.4% (BOPS); ~5,800 people
- Arrested because of gambling
 - Problem Gamblers: 0.8% (BGPS) 2.6% (BOPS); ~ 1,800 people
- Convicted of offense because of gambling
 Problem Gamblers: 0.0% (BGPS) 1.5% (BOPS); ~ 750 people
- Incarcerated because of gambling
 - Problem Gamblers: 0.0% (BGPS) 1.5% (BOPS); ~ 750 people



Problem Gamblers in MA

- 2.0% population prevalence; ~105,000 people
- Heard or seen media campaigns to prevent problem gambling in Massachusetts:
 - Gamblers: 49.8%
 - Problem Gamblers: 49.4% (BOPS) 50.0% (BGPS)
- Wanted help for gambling problems
 - Problem Gamblers: 8.7% (BOPS) 22.8% (BGPS)
- Sought help for gambling problems

- Problem Gamblers: 0.9% (BGPS) - 11.3% (BOPS)
