This Pop-Up is an expansion of the City’s successful, two-year brick and mortar Project: Pop-Up program. Emerging brands, entrepreneurs, artists, and makers will take week-long turns popping up in the temporary mobile retail unit. To help ensure their success, the brands would be provided the opportunity at a subsidized rate and will receive access to a suite of resources provided by the City’s consultant and woman-owned business, Up-Next, LLC.</p> <p>This program allows smaller businesses without a traditional brick-and-mortar location to introduce their products to a wider audience during peak holiday shopping season in a way they would not be able to otherwise.</p>

<p>As identified in the guidelines, public safety grants are intended to assist municipalities in addressing the increased public safety operational costs associated with the introduction of a gaming establishment to the region. Increased visitation and employment due to the casino will likely increase the interaction between public safety personnel, casino patrons, employees and Melrose residents. The influx of visitors to a casino and its nearby communities can result in an increase in calls for service and put pressure on local emergency services including emergency responders like police and fire departments and EMS. This could lead to increased needs emergency services and traffic.</p>

<p>With the expansion of Encore, the anticipated increase in visitor traffic is expected to result in a higher volume of traffic-related incidents. To proactively address these concerns, the City of Melrose Police Department plans to purchase a hybrid police vehicle dedicated to traffic enforcement. This vehicle will be instrumental in responding to citizen complaints, investigating traffic crashes, and addressing speeding violations based on collected speed data.</p>	
<p>The addition of a hybrid police vehicle will enhance the department’s ability to conduct high-visibility patrols in areas experiencing increased congestion. These patrols will play a crucial role in mitigating casino-related traffic issues, including congestion, impaired driving, and auto theft. By increasing enforcement presence, the department aims to improve overall road safety, deter reckless driving behaviors, and provide a more efficient response to traffic-related incidents. This investment aligns with the department’s commitment to sustainability and cost efficiency, as a hybrid vehicle will reduce fuel consumption and lower long-term operational costs. <p>Project Title: <i>Next Steps for Sustained Gambling Prevention and Education</i></p>	
<p>Project Overview:</p> <p>Building on the foundation established in the initial phase of this work in FY25, this next phase will focus on solidifying efforts to reduce gambling harm among Melrose students and community members, as well as expanding efforts throughout the Mystic Valley region. The project will continue data collection and analysis, refine the social norms communication campaigns, implement evidence-based programs like Photovoice, further develop financial literacy programs, and enhance resource dissemination. This phase aims to ensure long-term sustainability, increased community engagement, and measurable reductions in gambling-related harms.</p>	
<p>Project Narrative:</p> <p>1. Expand Data Collection and Analysis/Monitor and Evaluate:</p> <p>We will continue gathering qualitative data from Melrose Public Schools students and community members, ensuring that our focus groups and key informant interviews specifically reflect the demographic composition of Melrose, including age, ethnicity and socioeconomic status. By using these data, we will assess trends in</p>	

gambling behaviors and how they intersect with other public health issues such as substance use, mental health and family dynamics. We will track these trends over time, allowing us to adjust the intervention as needed based on the specific risk factors present in the Melrose region. To ensure ongoing effectiveness and regional adaptation, we will implement a continuous evaluation framework, tracking key metrics such as changes in gambling behavior, financial literacy and community attitudes towards gambling. We will use real-time data monitoring from schools, local health centers, and community organizations to adjust the interventions as needed. This ongoing evaluation will help us measure progress in gambling harm reduction and identify emerging trends in Melrose, ensuring that our strategies remain relevant and evidence-based.

2. Refine Social Norms Campaigns:

The social norms campaigns will be specifically tailored to the cultural and demographic makeup of the Mystic Valley Region. Using local gambling data and other public health insights from residents, we will refine our messaging to address the specific norms and behaviors present in this community. The campaigns will focus on engaging students, parents and seniors, using data on gambling-related harms to highlight the risks. Additionally, we will leverage community assets such as local influencers, schools, senior homes and community centers to amplify our messaging. For example, if the data shows higher engagement in gambling activities among certain age groups, our campaigns will focus on those groups with targeted, data-driven interventions.

3. Incorporate [Massachusetts Photovoice](#) and [Community Wellness](#) Projects:

As part of our community engagement efforts, we will incorporate Massachusetts Photovoice Project to involve school youth in documenting their own experiences with gambling and its impacts. Through photovoice workshops, school students will use photography as a tool to express their personal stories and concerns about gambling harm. This approach will help us better understand the social determinants of gambling behaviors, identify community strengths and challenges, and further tailor our interventions to community needs. We will also integrate gambling prevention by community wellness project. Gambling prevention messages will be embedded within the broader wellness campaigns that focus on mental health, substance use prevention and financial stability. Through community health fairs, workshops and wellness events, we will engage residents in gambling harm reduction efforts while promoting overall community health. Data from these community projects will also be used to evaluate the effectiveness of our interventions in improving community resilience and health outcomes.

4. Expand Financial Literacy Education:

We will expand our financial literacy workshops to focus on the financial challenges specific to the community. Data from Melrose's public health assessment will guide the curriculum, focusing on family, older population and individuals who are most vulnerable to gambling-related harm due to financial instability. We will provide financial management tools tailored to the needs of Melrose residents. These workshops will also emphasize the direct correlation between financial stress and gambling behaviors, helping participants understand the risks associated with poor financial decision-making. Furthermore, specialized sessions will be offered for parents in high-risk neighborhoods identified by local health data.

5. Sustain Resource Dissemination:

To ensure continued access to gambling-related resources, we will expand our partnership with the Massachusetts Department of Public Health's Office of Problem Gambling. Ongoing distribution of educational materials, community events, and outreach initiatives will ensure that Melrose residents and regional visitors have the necessary resources to seek help and reduce gambling-related harms. We will also work to create a permanent online hub for these resources.

Conclusion:

This next phase of the Gambling Prevention and Education Program builds on the successes of the initial

phase while expanding efforts to ensure lasting community change. By refining interventions, expanding outreach, and continuously assessing impact, this program will continue to reduce gambling-related harms, increase responsible behaviors, and foster more informed and resilient communities.

<p>Over the past year, we have organized monthly trips to the Encore Casino in Everett, MA, in response to popular demand from members of the Milano Center, a senior center serving Melrose residents. During this period, 107 individuals have participated in at least one of these trips, with 22% attending multiple times. While we strive to accommodate member requests and plan events that we know participants enjoy, we also recognize the financial impact of these casino trips, especially for a population where many individuals are on a fixed income.</p>

<p>The Milano Center is proposing an initiative to expand participation in activities and trips for older adults by offering high-quality programming that does not encourage gambling. This initiative could include contracting local musicians, theater productions, and other entertainment options that the center would not typically be able to afford.</p> <p>This strategy aims to achieve two key goals:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Supporting Local Arts and Culture – By hiring local entertainers, artists, and instructors, the Milano Center would contribute to the sustainability of the local arts community while providing enriching experiences for its members. 2. Expanding Access to Affordable Entertainment – By diversifying its programming, the center would offer participants more opportunities to engage in enjoyable, non-gambling-related activities, potentially increasing overall attendance. <p>However, a significant challenge remains: the rising costs associated with booking quality entertainers. Securing additional funding or partnerships will be essential to making this vision a reality.</p>
