Notice of Public Hearing

Notice is hereby provided that in accordance with G.L. c. 30A § 2, the Massachusetts Gaming Commission (“Commission”) will convene a public hearing for purposes of gathering comments, ideas, and information relative to proposed amendments to 205 CMR. The proposal was developed pursuant to G.L. c. 23K § 5, as part of the Commission’s regulation promulgation process. The proposal includes the following amendments:

205 CMR 6.35: Pick (n) Pools. The proposed amendment describes the addition of further wagers to the regulation.

205 CMR 102.02: Definitions. The proposed amendments add the terms and define “Minority Business Enterprise (MBE),” “Veteran Business Enterprise (VBE),” and “Women Business Enterprise (WBE)” to now apply to post-construction casino operations as well as to the construction and development of the casinos.

205 CMR 143.02: Progressive Gaming Devices. This amendment to describe an update to progressive controller security provisions.

205 CMR 152.00: Individuals Excluded From a Gaming Establishment. The proposed amendments are general updates and clarifications to Involuntary Exclusion provisions to ensure effective application.
