

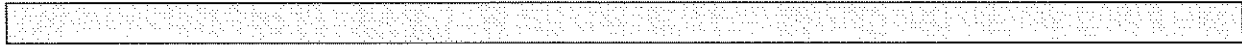

III. Detailed Project Description & Mitigation
<p>1) Please describe in detail the impact that is attributed to the operation of a gaming facility. Please provide documentation or evidence that gives support for the determination that the operation of the gaming facility caused or is causing the impact (i.e. surveys, data, reports).</p>
<p>The Ludlow Police Department believes that mere proximity to Springfield where the casino is located creates an impact to Town of Ludlow. This is similar to the grant award from last year where proximity creates increased motor vehicle traffic and increased population. In the grant award from last year, we looked to address the problem of increased traffic flow and crime with obtaining products that would assist in those issues. This year we are going with that same theory, but putting together a package that if obtained would help us with public safety, mental health, and de-escalation.</p> <p>In 2022, Springfield Police Department dealt with a police officer being shot with a flare gun by a man who was denied entry at the MGM Casino. This is a basic scenario that could possibly happen at any business in the Commonwealth. Through our grant proposal if able to obtain the items requested, we believe will help the Ludlow Police Department to de-escalate and resolve any situation large or small.</p> <p>We also feel that we are in a unique position because part of our grant package will benefit our members of the Hampden County Special Response Team which has members from three (3) bordering communities of Springfield (West Springfield, Chicopee and Ludlow). The HCSRT team is also a regional asset to Hampden County in which Springfield is located in the heart of. All participating agencies have a mutual aid pact with Springfield.</p>

<p>The Ludlow Police Department is proposing a plan to upgrade the capabilities of Community Outreach, De-Escalation, Communication and Safe Resolutions of incidents that our officers could come into contact with. The vehicle we are seeking to purchase completes our Community Outreach program by being the last piece of the puzzle needed to effectively and efficiently run the DART program and help those intertwined with overdose incidents, at risk individuals or behavioral health events. This helping hand outreaches to not only those personally affected, but their families as well.</p> <p>The Ludlow Police Department currently has eight (8) Officers that are assigned to the Hampden County Special Response Team (HCSRT) which was designed to respond to higher-</p>

risk situations including, but not limited to; hostage rescue operations, barricaded subject operations, high-risk warrant service, high-risk apprehension operations and high-risk security operations. The HCSRT is a multi-jurisdictional unit that will respond 24/7 throughout Hampden County and parts of Hampshire County. The HCSRT is made up of members from Ludlow, Chicopee and West Springfield, all of whom border the City of Springfield. The members assigned from the Ludlow Police Department are currently operating with tactical vests and body armor that is expired by the manufacturer. The Ludlow Police Department is seeking to obtain grant funding for this protective equipment. The officers that are assigned to this team are the some of the most highly trained individuals within the department. They are trained in a variety of de-escalation tactics, tools and scenarios. They are used in situations of utmost importance and safety.

The other equipment that is requested revolves around communication, safety and options for officers to use to come to a safe resolution during a variety of incidents. Use of Force is a current hot topic in all of policing and at the Ludlow Police Department, we feel that with providing our officers with the latest and greatest Use of Force tools, it will help all members of the department.

Scope of Work

a. **2023 Chevrolet Tahoe** - The Ludlow Police Department is very active in the community with the DART and CIMS programs. The DART Program is a team made up of Police Officers, Counselors and Clinicians that prevent opioid overdose and other substance misuse through personal connection, harm reduction, referral to treatment resources, and family support. DART is a free service offered in Western Massachusetts. The program provides Naloxone and safety planning, recovery and peer mental health coaching, helping families support their loved ones, bereavement support and guidance to essential services. The CIMS program is a software that facilitates the maintenance and analysis of all law enforcement data related to overdose incidents, at-risk individuals, behavioral health events, and follow-up home visit information. The Ludlow Police Department is looking to purchase a vehicle that will allow our team of police officers, counselors and clinicians to respond to these affected residences discreetly to protect the privacy of all those involved. The size of the vehicle was taken into

consideration so that it will be able to fit our team members. This vehicle will also be used to tow and move our speed trailer that was a Massachusetts Gaming Commission Grant award last year.

b. Implicit Bias and ICAT De-Escalation Training Class – The Ludlow Police Department recognizes that Implicit Bias and De-Escalation Techniques are paramount in the field of policing in this day and age. The Ludlow Police Department is seeking to hold an 8 hour training class for all of its members to refresh and enhance current skills as well as increase the level of training as a whole within the Department. ICAT is a use-of force Training Guide designed to fill a critical gap in training police officers in how to respond to volatile situations in which subjects are behaving erratically and often dangerously, but do not possess a firearm.

“ In almost every situation where a subject is behaving erratically (often because of mental illness or behavioral crisis), it is a patrol officer – a “beat cop” – who is the first to respond. ICAT provides these officers with the skills and options needed to safely and effectively manage these encounters, especially in the critical first few moments after officers arrive. In many instances, the goal is for the first responding officers to buy enough time so that additional, specialized resources can get to the scene to support a safe and peaceful resolution.” ICAT is also endorsed by the Police Executive Research Forum.

c. 40MM Less-Lethal Package – The Ludlow Police Department is seeking to upgrade our current less-lethal capabilities to allow our officers the highest level of equipment and the most quality options to further the goal to safely de-escalate and diffuse any situation that they could possibly encounter. This 40MM Less-Lethal package is the growing trend in policing today as it offers a higher effective range, and gives the officer the ability to keep an appropriate distance from the person, which allows the officer more opportunity to safely talk and de-escalate the situation if possible. The 40MM is an upgrade to our existing Less-Lethal package as it is more accurate and causes less injury. A documented study shows that the 40MM Less-Lethal launcher cuts the number of rounds needed in half compared to the Less-Lethal Shotgun. There are no cases of penetrating trauma known to the MPTC.

d. Brinc Communication Ball – The Brinc Communication Ball is a two-way communication device “built to enhance de-escalation capabilities of First Responders.” This communication device is a tremendous help to any agency by allowing for communication to be possible during a variety of dangerous situations to include individuals suffering from a mental episode, a barricaded individual, or even someone that is trapped in a location in which a first responder is unable to gain access to them at that moment.

e. Tactical Vests and Body Armor - The Police Department currently has eight officers that are assigned to the HCSRT which was designed to respond to higher-risk situations including, but not limited to; hostage rescue operations, barricaded subject operations, high-risk

warrant service, high-risk apprehension operations & high-risk security operations. The HCSRT is a multijurisdictional unit that will respond 24/7 throughout Hampden County and parts of Hampshire County. Officers not only conduct special operations but they are also required to attend 192 hours a year of specialized team training specific to the HCSRT standard operating procedures (SOP) and suggested requirements of the National Tactical Officers Association (NTOA). Each officer will attend training 16 hours a month in which all his/her gear is required which includes our current tactical vest carrier and body armor. Officers are not only required to train with their vests they are also required to pass a rigorous physical fitness test two times per year which also requires the use of their tactical vest throughout the duration of the testing procedures.

Our current and past team members specific to the Ludlow Police Department were issued these ballistic vests and body armor in 2015 & 2016. They are now approaching six and seven years of age. As with any body armor that is issued, the typical manufacturer's warranty does not exceed a five-year limit. Therefore, our current issued vests do not fall within those standards. Not only has the warranty expired for ballistic purposes, but the vests are also beginning to become battered, torn, and frayed based on the hours and conditions each vest endures.

These officers that are assigned to this specialized unit are subjected not only to a higher level of training but also subjected to a higher risk for injury. These officers typically are faced with known assailants in which the potential for violence may be imminent. Therefore, they require a higher caliber of body armor which a patrol-based officer is not. Based on the aforementioned facts; I respectfully ask the following equipment be considered as our safety is first and foremost and we are currently at a critical level in which that may not be guaranteed.

f. **BOLA Wrap** – The Bola Wrap is a tool that is advertised to “empower public safety with innovative training and tools to take individuals safely into custody without having to use force and reducing the risk of injury to subjects and to officers.” The Bola Wrap is a tool that discharges a Kevlar cord that can temporarily restrain an individual from up to 25 feet away. With one deployment of the Bola Wrap and wrapping the subject's arms or legs, officers can restrict the subject's mobility and restrain without incident. BolaWrap is quickly becoming the tool officers are using to safely restrain non-compliant individuals without injury or using higher levels of force. The Ludlow Police Department is looking to obtain the BolaWrap to continue our tools and abilities to de-escalate a wide variety of situations to keep our officers and the public safe.

g. **Terminator-X Riot Helmet** – During 2020, the Ludlow Police Department had two (2) planned protests within the Town. Additional personnel had to be requested via mutual aid for specialized gear to include protective helmets. The Ludlow Police Department is planning to use these helmets for the protection of our officers in combination with the De-Escalation

Training that we are looking to obtain through this grant to have the ability to safely handle any future protests of civil unrest.

The Police Department currently has eight officers that are assigned to the HCSRT which was designed to respond to higher-risk situations including, but not limited to; hostage rescue operations, barricaded subject operations, high-risk warrant service, high-risk apprehension operations & high-risk security operations. The HCSRT is a multijurisdictional unit that will respond 24/7 throughout Hampden County and parts of Hampshire County. Officers not only conduct special operations but they are also required to attend 192 hours a year for specialized team training specific to the HCSRT standard operating procedures (SOP) and suggested requirements of the National Tactical Officers Association (NTOA). Therefore, based on this assessment, I believe that is absolutely paramount that the town procures these listed items. This level of protection has not been purchased in over six years and with a new purchase will last at minimum another five years which is a very small investment that could potentially save the life of an officer.


