## **III. Detailed Project Description & Mitigation**

1) Please describe in detail the impact that is attributed to the operation of a gaming facility. Please provide documentation or evidence that gives support for the determination that the operation of the gaming facility caused or is causing the impact (i.e. surveys, data, reports).

The Westcomm Regional Communications Dispatch now dispatches for the Longmeadow and East Longmeadow public safety agencies which are communities that are part of the agreement with MGM Springfield. The Town of Ludlow is also part of this agreement with MGM Springfield. All of these municipalities have public safety radio systems that are "Phase 2 Trunking" systems which cannot be monitored by the Wilbraham Police and Fire interoperability radios identified unless they receive a software update. Wilbraham borders Ludlow and East Longmeadow. Wilbraham is near Longmeadow and all of the communities mentioned provide frequent mutual aid ambulance coverage. The project is to request funding for a software update which will allow 10 police vehicle radios, 5 fire vehicle radios and 1 police portable radio to be "Phase 2 Trunking" capable so that these units will be able to communicate with the agencies who are now on this type of radio system. In order to comply with Massachusetts Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP), each of these units will also need to be programmed with AES type encryption. In order to be compliant with systems in place in surrounding towns, these units will also need to be programmed with the feature "Over the Air Programing". An Interoperability Communications Investment Proposal (ICIP) form has been submitted to icb@mass.gov and is attached to this application.

The Motorola local vendor, Norcomm, Inc. was provided the software profile of each device and evaluated which features are necessary for the upgrade. A state contract PSE01 account quote is attached which indicates which software features are needed to update the 16 devices / units.

 (If applicable) Please explain how this impact was not anticipated in the Applicant's Host or Surrounding Community Agreement.

Ludlow and Westcomm Dispatch recently updated their radio systems after MGM Springfield opened. The Westcomm Dispatch radio system covers Longmeadow and East Longmeadow. Ludllow, Longmeadow, Wilbraham, and East Longmeadow are covered by MGM Springfield surrounding community agreements. Wilbraham did not anticipate that these agencies would be moving to this type of system when Wilbraham purchased their equipment.

3) Please describe what the Applicant is proposing and how the mitigation request will address the impact indicated.

The project is to request funding for a software update which will allow 10 police vehicle radios, 5 fire vehicle radios, and one police portable radio to be "Phase 2 Trunking" capable so that these units will be able to communicate with the agencies who are now on this type of radio system. This will mitigate the issue of these units not being able to directly monitor or communicate with other towns impacted by MGM Springfield. These agencies, which are covered under surrounding community agreements, updated their radio systems after MGM Springfield opened. These updates created this compatibility issue. This impact was not addressed in Wilbraham's surrounding community agreement. The software update is a one-time expense which will solve this issue.

This will increase the ability for these agencies to communicate with the Wilbraham units. This software update will also future proof these units into being interoperable for other potential uses to communicate with public safety agencies on all levels. All of the proposed Wilbraham Police units were purchased within the previous year and have a life expectancy of at least fifteen years. The units are ten (10) Motorola APX8500 mobile radios and one (1) Motorola APX8000 portable radio. The Wilbraham Fire vehicle units are five (5) APX1500 mobile radios.

### Investment Summary (describe your project)

The Wilbraham Police and Fire Departments are public safety agencies for the Town of Wilbraham. Wilbraham Police and Fire vehicles are equipped with Motorola APX8500/APX1500 mobile radios for interoperability. Surrounding communities have transitioned to UHF trunked systems which the Wilbraham radios are incapable of communicating without an option upgrade. This upgrade will enhance interoperability for the Wilbraham Police and Fire Departments. The project consists of the following software upgrades to the radios: "Phase 2 Trunking", "AES Encryption", "Over the Air Programming". The upgrade will be to the following Motorola radios: 10 police APX8500 mobiles, 1 police APX8000 portable, and 5 fire APX1500 mobiles.

### **Communications Interoperability Problem Description**

Communications is vital to successfully interoperability between communities.

### **Background Information / Detailed Investment Description**

Surrounding communities of Wilbraham have migrated to UHF trunked systems which the noted Wilbraham Police and Fire equipment cannot access. Radio option upgrades will allow the Police and Fire Department radios the ability to communicate with neighboring communities.

- 5. **Cached Radios.** Cached radios purchased, upgraded, or programmed from SIEC-approved funding <u>must</u> include the standard interoperability template as identified in the MTCP.
- 6. Radio Reprogramming. Any reprogramming of existing equipment supported by SIEC-approved funds will follow the conditions above. If a reprogrammed radio does not possess the channel capacity to meet the MTCP programming requirements above, the SIEC will provide additional guidance.
